## RE.LEGAL OPINION ON THE WRONGFUL CONVICTION OF CARMEN RICE

The reference is made from the caption mentioned above.

Having gone through the **BRIEF CASE PROCEEDINGS**, **WITNESS STATEMENTS AND CONVICTION OF CARMEN RICE** we would like to advice as follows.

## **BRIEF FACTS.**

That Carmen Rice, was picked by Richland police department on November 2003, and was wrongfully convicted of a Capital Offence of Murder and Robbery.

Having gone through the proceedings and the conviction of Carmen Rice we observed the following
